It is also the opinion of the MWGM that the WGM's intention to "reset" your Grand Jurisdiction as of March 2021 will best serve the membership, and will aid in restoring a more familiar normalcy during these unusual times going forward in 2021.

The bible tells us repeatedly how all children are a gift from God. Every single child is a blessing. My Special Project this year is the New Brunswick Children's Foundation. When I was thinking about what I would like to have as my project, I knew from the beginning that whatever it was, it would involve helping children in New Brunswick. Of course, I turned to Google...where else! When I discovered the New Brunswick Children's Foundation and began to read their history and their mission, I knew without a doubt, that was what I wanted to support. You see, the foundation isn't really new to New Brunswick. Its roots stretch back to the mid-1800s, first as the Saint John Protestant Orphans' Home Asylum, then in 1922, the name was changed to the New Brunswick Protestant Orphans' Home. Though the name and configuration of the Home changed over the years – its mission to support children remained their focus. To this day, it continues to enrich the lives of children all over our province by giving

grants to groups, such as Camp Goodtime, which our Masonic Brothers also support; Autism Connections here in Fredericton and the Stan Cassidy Foundation, are just a few of the many, many groups they help. In the spring of 2019, it awarded the Children's Learning Dyslexic Centre, which is Brother Darrell's Special Project, a grant of \$15,000.00.

As a side note, when I was reading some proceedings and OES magazines from the earlier years, I was pleased to read that several of our Past Grand Matrons and Patrons had also supported the New Brunswick Protestant Orphan's Home during their term, as did several of our chapters. I discovered that at the Vesper Service in 1951, the collection was given to the Protestant Orphan's Home and also at the "Star in the East" Session in 1952. Brother Don has worked tirelessly, compiling the information, printing and reprinting and there aren't enough words to express my love, my thanks and my gratitude for all his hard work. It is truly a labour of love.

The cost for the book will be \$20. It would also make a wonderful gift to give to some of our members, who would enjoy reading it and reminiscing on a trip down memory lane. You can connect with Bro. Don about obtaining a copy and details on how to get a copy will also be in the magazine and on the website.

I also crocheted a Star throw, which we will also be selling tickets on. Brother Darrell and I have made the decision that we will be sharing all the proceeds we receive for our projects. He will explain to you more about his special project and the beautiful items you have an opportunity to win.

Sisters & Brothers, when you received your program, you saw that Sister Jean's name was still listed as one of our officers. It is not a mistake. Her name is there as a tribute to the many, many years she gave to our Order. I had the honour to serve in 15 Grand families with Sister Jean as either the Grand Organist or Assistant Gr. Organist. She may not be with us in the physical sense, but her spirit is very present here today.

In closing, I would like to share with you, this quote from Helen Keller:

EASTERN STAR MAGAZINE REPORT 2020 & 2021

WGM, WGP, Grand Chapter Officers, Sisters & Brothers,

May of 2020 began our 71st year of publication. The Covid-19 Pandemic had already reached New Brunswick and by May we were in full lockdown. All Chapter meetings were cancelled for member safety, until further notice and, after much deliberation, July's Grand Chapter Sessions were cancelled as well.

The reports we receive from the Chapters usually comprise one third to one half of the total content of our magazine. The cover color photos and those within are a source of pride for many, serving to further bring the pages to life. Much of our subscription revenues are received at the annual Grand Chapter Sessions; and, we were immediately faced with a dilemma.

What would the 2020 Eastern Star Magazine look like? How many annual issues could we afford to publish? How could we fill its many pages and with what? When the current Committee assumed publication of the

Magazine in 2007, it had already been relegated to pass into history. The question was, "Should we finally allow the Eastern Star Magazine to die?"

The Feb. 2020 issue had already been printed in January. Now with the May issue pending it was decided to continue the printing. There were only enough chapter meetings before the shutdown to fill 5 of the usual 14 pages of this issue and 4 photos. This issue dropped to 24 of its usual 36 pages. This was the most difficult issue to compile in all 14 years.

The August 2020 issue was next. Most of its content surrounded the events of Grand Chapter and the introduction of the new Grand Officers – all of which was postponed until 2021. With more time to plan and much creative thought, this issue was 32 pages. We had reports from our PGMs and PGPs about how they were managing through the ongoing Pandemic. The "Home Maker" page continued by Sis. Cindy and was expanded to 2 pages. I introduced three feature pages entitled, "Honouring Grand Nurses". Three more pages gave a historical back-ground of the 1918 Pandemic. We discovered Millie's Neighbours, Kevin Wilson's "Thoughts for the Day", Photos of a get-together bubble, 2 'star' weddings, a 95th Birthday and a very special music maker.

The Nov issue became the Dec 2020 issue and was full sized. It was much the same as earlier Dec issues with a few changes and additions. I published one of the WGM's talks called "On Santa's Team" and continued the feature pages with, "Honouring Grand Organists". This was followed by (with Sister Corley Anne Byras' permission), her "What's That Word" of Musical terms from her monthly Maine Newsletter. A page on Lady Alexander Chapter's annual School Project, a star 'bubble', Kevin's 'Thoughts for the Day' and our Season's Greetings. "Angels were chosen as the 2020 theme; as, with the ongoing pandemic, we all need an angel to watch over us." Photos included a PGM bubble group 'Staycation', a Grand-Mom's birthday and 3 Bubble Pics.

With the Feb issues cancelled, our next issue was May 2021 and it was a full 36 page issue. The (3 month? long) Pandemic was still raging after a year and Grand Chapter has been trimmed to 1 day. This issue had some changes forced by the pandemic. Included was the AGM & AGP Appointed Grand Officer announcement. We've continued the feature pages, "Honouring Grand Marshals", and followed with the History feature "Bro. R. Donald Stewart, PMWGP." Sis. Corley's "What's That Word" features Rob Morris, and I've introduced her themed "Greetings from the East" (on Friendship) to be a source of WM introductions. An article on Robert Morris giving a 'Voice to Women'. Photos were of Christmas visits and 'Springtime Greetings'.

Vaccinations against the Pandemic are expected to be completed by this fall and we hope to resume our meetings and get 'Back to Normal' sometime thereafter. With that in mind, when we do resume our meetings I would remind you to resume sending in your reports of chapter meetings and projects to keep the content alive and interesting to those who subscribe.

Don't forget that each magazine is now archived in the Harriet Irving Library in Fredericton, and that they form an important part of the historical record of our Grand Chapter. Through its pages, your children and grandchildren may one day find your name or photo; something that they will connect with and cherish.

So . . . thanks to all the Press Correspondents, Secretaries and Star Sisters and Brothers for sending pictures, member milestones and special events to Sister Lynda Williams, our AGM, for inclusion in the magazine. Please keep her informed of address changes; so that, you will never miss an issue.

FRATERNAL REPORT

Lynda Williams, Associate Grand Matron

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Ambassador, General Grand Chapter Committee Members, Past Grand Matrons, Past Grand Patrons, all our Distinguished Guests, Sisters and Brothers.

The idea of Fraternal Correspondence between Grand Chapters started in 1876 by a Worthy Grand Matron of Connecticut and continues to this day in many jurisdictions.

I got to travel the globe last year, even though our beautiful world was in the midst of a pandemic, and borders were closed. I had no worries of bad weather, delayed or cancelled flights, living out of a suitcase in hotels or having to be up bright and early to attend sessions. Yes, I got to enjoy several Grand Chapter sessions and no matter where I went in my travels of the Eastern Star World, I found Sisters and Brothers ready to welcome everyone with open arms. The friendships I made will last a lifetime....friendships that would not have happened without my membership in this beautiful order.

Since our Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Charlotte, hails from Saskatchewan, I thought I would make that my first stop. Upon arriving in Saskatoon for “The Ties that Bind” session, I read a sign that said, “Saskatoon Shines”. Well it certainly did during my time there. The Worthy Grand Matron Colleen Hozack and Worthy Grand Patron Bruce Farrer’s **Aim** was “Enjoy the little things in life, because one day you may look back and realize they were the BIG things”. One of the WGM’s fun symbols was the Maple Leaf and the WGP’s flowers were those native to Saskatchewan, just like Sister Charlotte’s. Saskatchewan only has 15 Chapters and were able to raise \$10,000 for their special project, KidSport...which is aimed at letting all kids play.

Another highlight for me was to once again get a warm hug from the energetic, “get things done,” Canadian Chairman of the Service Dog Committee, Sister Llynne Lambert. I truly enjoyed my time in Saskatoon, but it was time to be off on my next adventure....Virginia!

Arriving in Virginia, I checked into the Fairview Park Marriott Hotel, and was immediately, warmly greeted by Sisters and Brothers who were also there to attend the “Garden of Friendship” 123rd Session of the Grand Chapter of the District of Columbia. The chapter room was decorated with a Winnie the Pooh, Piglet, Eeyore, theme and certainly brought a smile to the 127 members in attendance. They only have 5 chapters in this jurisdiction, 13 of the Grand Officers are Past Grands which also included the Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Donna Williams and Worthy Grand Patron Brother Ronald Wagner. Their membership of 475 managed to raise over \$16,000 for various charities and they also give their Grand Secretary an honourarium of \$10,000, proving once again that size doesn’t matter when you are willing to serve and work for the needs of others.

Since it was only early May and I had a couple of weeks before attending the Grand Chapter of New Jersey, in Atlantic City, I decided to take in the sights of Washington, DC and also visit the home of our International Headquarters. All I can say is “WOW”. So much history is housed within these beautiful walls and I was truly overwhelmed by it all.

The Grand Chapter of New Jersey was the first Grand Chapter I have ever visited that is directly under the umbrella of General Grand Chapter, so having the Grand Officers with the same titles as those of General Grand, seemed a tad strange to me. The Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Donna Affsa and Most Worthy Grand Patron Brother Emil Affsa are husband and wife and presided over the 148th session. It was called the “Spirt of Christmas” and the theme was evident all around. There were Christmas trees, wreaths, snowmen, teddy bears and “Flamingos”?... ok, not exactly Christmassy, but cute none the less. During their year, 280

Sisters and Brothers reached very special milestones. 126 members received their 50 year pin, 98 achieved 60 years, 44 attained 70 years, 9 deserving members reached 75 years and 3 Sisters and Brothers celebrated the astonishing milestone of 80 years of service to the Order. To attain that many years of service is truly amazing. What a fun time I was having, but with only 3 days to spare till the opening of the Grand Chapter of British Columbia and the Yukon, I had to be on my way.

The “Smiles, Kindness and A Little Bit of Magic” Session was being held in beautiful, Vernon, BC. It was their 108th year and it was wonderful to be in this part of Canada, as this was my first visit to the west coast of our country. Once again, the Worthy Grand Matron Sister Arlene Hallam shared the East with her husband, Worthy Grand Patron Brother Terry Hallam. They referred to their Grand Officers as their Maple Leaf Grand Family. Husband and wife teams and Maple Leaf themes seem to be trending.

The sessions didn’t start till after lunch, so I got to catch up on a few “zzz’s” in the morning...jetlag, even from home on my comfy couch, was starting to kick in. This Grand jurisdiction takes in a large geographical area, but they still have a healthy membership of 2242 members and currently 42 chapters are thriving. Their main project was the Alzheimer’s Society of British Columbia and they were able to donate close to \$12,000 to this worthy cause. They also actively support a number of other charities throughout the province.

One of events that I love to watch at some of the Grand Chapters, is the Cavalcade of Flags. BC has been including the flag presentation since 1982 and there were 63 flags in the procession. As each flag was presented, those presenting made comments about the jurisdiction that the flag represented. Of course, I was beaming with pride when our New Brunswick flag was carried in. Sister Trudy Sloan, on behalf of Grand Representative Brother Eddy Jalbert, carried the New Brunswick flag and her comments were “No proceedings were received for review, however I can attest to their website and that they have one of the best Service Dog websites within Eastern Star and I highly recommend it for everyone to have a look.” Way to go New Brunswick!

Looking at the map and with a week to spare till the United Grand Chapter of Australia, I thought, sure...why not. It’s only a hop, skip and jump across the Pacific Ocean. So off to the land, down-under and another season...late fall, soon to be winter, in June. Fortunately, their winter months and ours are quite different. Australia is another jurisdiction that falls under General Grand Chapter and they only have sessions every 2 years, which means that their Most Worthy Grand Matron Sister Helen

McLaughlan and Most Worthy Grand Patron Brother Michael Struthers had been presiding for the 2 year term. This was Australia's 17th Biennial Session. They had lots of tours and events for members to partake in. Those of us not from there were referred to as "Overseas" members. They laid out the rules for members while in sessions re: no food or drink permitted unless for medical conditions; all cell phones to remain on silent or vibrate and absolutely no texting while meetings are in progress. Photography was also not permitted except for the marches. Australia is seeing the same decline in membership that is plaguing Eastern Star chapters worldwide. In the 35 years that they have been in existence, their membership has suffered a great loss of members, going from 6944 to just 1514.

It's hard to believe that only a few short months after visiting their session that their beautiful country would be ravished by extreme bush fires that would result in such devastation and loss. Our prayers go out to our Sisters and Brothers as they try to rebuild their lives and I'm happy to report that the fires did subside and things are getting back to the normal.

After farewells and lots of hugs, my journey brought me back to the US, to the lovely state of Pennsylvania.

The Grand Chapter of Pennsylvania was celebrating their 123rd year with "The Heart of the Cross is Love" session. The first event of the day was the Grand Banquet....Grand being the operative word. Sister Diana Michael, WGM and Brother William Johnston, WGP, greeted their 765 guests who entered the ballroom to "A Valentine's Gala: Death By Chocolate" banquet. There was a "Kissing Booth" where they handed out chocolate kisses as well as a "100 Grand Chocolate Man" statue adjacent to the booth. There were so many beautiful decorations, I didn't know where to look first. There was a fully operational water fountain with lighted letters spelling out the word "LOVE", surrounded by a garden of roses, Calla Lilies and Valentine heart topiaries. There were lights, marble columns topped with urns of flowers, mirrored balls and red heart balloons. Red foil heart box centerpieces filled with red roses, Calla lilies and iris' graced the tables and small red foil heart boxes packed with handmade rose and heart shaped chocolates were the table favours. For a brief moment, I thought that perhaps I had crashed an elegant wedding reception. While the guests were enjoying their "Death by Chocolate" dessert, there was an announcement that a crime had been committed...a Murder...the head of the "100 Grand Chocolate Man" was missing. We were then treated to a humorously acted out investigation into the "murder" by non-other than Chief Detective Henry O'Holmes and his assistant, Cooke Watson.

Besides the “Love” theme abounding throughout, the WGP’s fun symbols of Golf Balls, Drivers and Putters was also evident everywhere. Brother Ronald Keith, you would have been in 7th heaven. The hospitality room was called the 19th Hole and of course was decorated with the golf theme of clubs, bags, tees, etc. The foyer was also decorated in a golf motif, with a red golf cart, a full size painting of a golfer and sponsorship signs from all the charity golf outing events that had taken place to raise funds for their charity. Even the hallways included a Putting Green activity. There had been 3 Charity Golf events which raised \$29,256 for their special project, which was Cancer. All in all, I had an awesome time and looked forward to my travels through New England, to home, to rest and try to lose the pounds I put on, eating all that chocolate.

My next adventure out of New Brunswick came in the beautiful season of Autumn and took me to the Belle Province of Quebec to attend the “Seasons in the Sun” session of their Grand Chapter. Sister Helen Black, WGM and Brother Bryan Mitchell, WGP had chosen Sun Youth as their special project for the year. Sun Youth work with individuals and families in need, by providing a range of emergency services such as food, clothing, medical, financial and material assistance. Sun Youth offers children 5-12 a day camp that is both fun and educational and youths 8-17 an alternative to channel their energy positively through sport while supporting education.

As the WGM’s fun symbol was Snoopy and the WGP’s was Woodstock, we entered the Grand Chapter room through the arbour which had been transformed into Snoopy’s dog house, with Snoopy and Woodstock sitting on top. A comfy blanket with the “Peanuts” comic strips printed on it was laid in front of the podium and each of the four seasons in the sun were depicted – Spring flowers were placed in a sap bucket surrounded with tiny bottles of maple syrup. We were reminded of Summer’s warm sun with sunglasses, a sunhat and flip flops, while Autumn leaves were placed around pumpkins and apples and it wouldn’t be Winter without poinsettias, Santa, a hockey stick and skates.

It was interesting to note that Quebec has adopted the same method of proving the chapter as we have....the use of your programme booklet as proof of membership. Quebec is a small jurisdiction with only 8 chapters and 242 members. Their Grand Officers included 2 Past Grand Matrons, 2 Past Grand Patrons, a GGCCM and their Associate Grand Conductress and Grand Sentinel were Pro tem officers.

Because the Grand Chapters of Quebec and Rhode Island overlap, I only stayed for the opening in Quebec and then rushed off the next morning for Rhode Island.

The Grand Chapter of Rhode Island is a small jurisdiction with only 6 chapters remaining. Like most of the smaller Grand Chapters, they are facing uncertain times ahead, but they are persevering. Once again, the Worthy Grand Matron, Deborah Therrien and Worthy Grand Patron, Richard Therrien, are husband and wife and 11 of their Grand Officers are from 1 chapter.

The name of their session was “DreaMuppets” and their theme was: “Working together with Hope for the Future.” This theme of working together with Hope was also reflected in their motto, scriptures and songs. The decorations revolved around, what else...the Muppets...with the message that we are all different, working together. Though the number of chapters is few, the members work hard to support food banks, collect toys for tots and support numerous other charities.

I was pleased to see that there was quite a few members from other Grand jurisdictions in attendance, as well as several concordant bodies. We were all warmly welcomed and thanked for attending. My time at their Grand Chapter was very short, but I left with a feeling that the members will not give up and will continue to do what they can to keep going. They had planned a lavish celebration to commemorate their 125th anniversary in 2020, but due to COVID – 19, it was necessary to postpone it. Congratulations to our Sisters and Brothers in Rhode Island on achieving this wonderful milestone!

Sisters and Brothers, this concludes my fraternal report and I would like to thank Brother Doug for sending me such a wonderful travel itinerary.

In every jurisdiction I traveled to, around the globe, although the titles, themes, and places were different, the Holy Bible was always open on the altar and the ritualistic work was the same. Yes, our membership is declining, but the common thread in every jurisdiction was the hard work of its members and their desire to do good and to provide for the many worthwhile causes in their Provinces and States. As we hear in our initiations, “we hear the cry of the orphan, the call of want” and it tugs at our heartstrings. No matter the size of the jurisdictions or the age of its’ Sisters and Brothers, we, as members of the Eastern Star are dedicated to Charity, Truth and Loving Kindness.

I will leave you with this Ritual quote of the Worthy Matron’s address, given to a new member during the initiation ceremony of 1865... “The greater our ability to do good, the more pleasure we shall enjoy.”
