The Star, the Emblem & Symbol of our Order, is formed by the Grand Pages & Grand Guards.

What is more beautiful than a Star? Our heroines gazed upon the same Stars in the night sky, as we do now. As members of the Order of the Eastern Star, the Star is not only in the title of our Order, but is a symbol of the eternal values we hold dear. The Star is our Symbol and our Emblem. Let us keep our Star shining and may we be guided as the men of old, by the STAR which we have seen in the East.

PENTAGON FORMATION (Grand Officers)

The Pentagon, the Symbol of our Grand Chapter, is formed by the Grand Officers.

Our Pentagon has 5 sides and 5 angles and encompasses our 5 Star Points. Christians once commonly used the pentagon to represent the five wounds of Jesus. At the General Grand Chapter Triennial Assembly in St. Louis, Missouri, in 1886, it was ordered that the jewels of a Grand Chapter be the emblems within a Star or a Triangle, within a Pentagon.

CIRCLE OF FRIENDSHIP (Grand Representatives)

The Circle of Friendship around the world, is formed by the Grand Representatives.

Grand Representatives are our goodwill ambassadors, commissioned with the task of spreading seeds of friendship & love. The world is a sphere, that goes 'round and 'round and all over the world Eastern Star friends are found.

It is such a privilege for me to be able to pay tribute to these three very important symbols of our proceedings, namely the Provincial Flag, the Christian Flag and the Order of The Eastern Star Flag.

In the early years the Province of New Brunswick was inhabited by Mih-Mah and Maliseet natives followed by settlers from France and British explorers — today we welcome peoples from every corner of the globe to share in our hospitality, our geography that makes us the picture province rich in culture and diversity. We a province of ship builders, farmers and fisherman, foresters all of which are still vital today. However improved access to educational possibilities and modern technology have created exciting opportunities for generations to come.

A coat of Arms assigned to our province in 1868 by Queen Victoria would be the precursor to our Provincial Flag which was adopted on Feb. 24th, 1965. They are Golden Lion on a Red Field across the top and an ancient Galley with its oars in action across the base in blue waters. The ship symbolizing our ship building and forestry, the blue our fishing and transportation, the Lion the House of Brunswick — Thus the name NEW BRUNSWICK.

The Christian Flag, with white for its purity, blue for courage, sincerity, faithfulness of our Saviour, and the red cross symbolizes the Christian religion, which has no geographical boundaries and embraces all nations and all peoples, God's Love for man and the promise of Eternal Life.

The Eastern Star Flag: A symbol of the teaching of our Order, representing the Bonds of Fraternalism for all counties of the World, who share a belief in a Supreme being. Our members may be singular in many of their day to day living but let us never forget the loyalty to the lessons that join and bind this loving fraternal Order together of Fidelity, Constancy, Purity, Faith, and Love.

It is a pleasure to introduce our Honoured Guests to our Informal Opening Angels Among the Stars Session. Thank You for spending time with us.

Province of New Brunswick, Premier Blaine Higgs sends his regrets. I would like to introduce Honorable Mary Wilson, Minister of Military Affairs, Province of New Brunswick. May we hear from you now.

Hon. Mary Wilson, Minister of Military Affairs Province of New Brunswick

Dignitaries and guests. Good evening, everyone. It is a privilege to be with you for the 91st annual sessions of the Order of the Eastern Stars.

The title of this evening's event, "Angels Among the Stars," is very fitting for the dedication and passion you share in working together to benefit the wellbeing of others, and the positive impact you continue to have on the lives of so many.

The list of organizations you have supported is remarkable and one of which you should be proud. This includes the two organizations that have been selected for this year:

The Children's Dyslexic Center of New Brunswick, and the New Brunswick Children's Foundation. As you may know, dyslexia is a brain-based learning difference and the most common cause of reading, writing and spelling difficulties.

However, as we know, dyslexia does not stop at the age of 18.

Dyslexia can make it very difficult for a student to succeed academically and, in its more severe forms, can qualify a student for special education, accommodations, or support services.

That is why the Government of New Brunswick, through the Department of Social Development, provides vital support to individuals and families living with significant learning challenges requiring extraordinary care and support

Social Development works in collaboration with other departments and community agencies when a client's needs require specialized or expert services They provide general assessment, guidance, assistance in creating case plans and referrals for persons living with disabilities.

Through the Family Supports for Children with Disabilities program, assistance is available for children up to the age of 18 with a significant disability.

The program supports the child and family's unmet needs related to the child's learning differences.

As of March 31st, 2022, there were one thousand-two-hundred-and-fifty-nine (1,259) families supported by the program, including families with children with dyslexia.

That is why our government also provides support to adults living with dyslexia through our:

Disability Support Program for adults up to the age of 64 years, Training and Employment Support Services, and Equal Employment Opportunity Program for persons who are limited in their ability to perform in the workplace due to a physical, intellectual, sensory, psychiatric or learning limitation.

We recognize that providing support to New Brunswickers living with dyslexia is essential, and I thank the Worthy Grand Patrons for selecting this important cause.

I also thank the Worthy Grand Matron for choosing the New Brunswick Children's Foundation as your special project for this year. The Foundation gives hope and opportunity to New Brunswick's children.

It works to enhance the lives of children challenged by health, social or economic issues by supporting communities and organizations across our Province that aim to enrich the lives of children in need.

Our government believes in the importance of supporting the children of our Province, and we are very grateful to the Foundation for its work. Earlier this month, our government implemented a new stand-alone Child and Youth Well-Being Act resulting from a comprehensive review of our child protection system. This new Legislation focuses primarily on promoting the interests, protection, participation and wellbeing of

children and youth, along with the health and wellbeing of families. It recognizes how early detection and intervention are critical in matters where the well-being of a child or youth may be at risk.

This Legislation is an important milestone for New Brunswick, as our province was the only jurisdiction in Canada that did not have standalone Legislation for issues related to child welfare.

We have also developed Professional Care Homes to support children with complex needs under the care of Social Development. These homes will provide full-time support to children in care, who have behavioural, mental health or complex special needs. There are currently 6 Professional Care Homes in the Province with additional Homes being recruited.

Financial and other assistance is also provided through our Subsidized Adoption Program to adoptive parents to assist with the special service or placement needs of the child.

During the fiscal year 2020-21, a monthly subsidy was provided to three-hundred-and forty-eight (348) adoption families

We recognize that every child needs a permanent home where they can thrive and grow, and every effort is made to find an adoptive family that best meets the child's specific needs over the long term.

If someone you know is considering or has questions about adopting a child, please encourage them to call the Department of Social Development to speak to one of our social workers.

Partnering and strengthening relationships with our community partners to improve the lives of children in New Brunswick is a priority for our government.

And we are very grateful for your work and the values you stand for. They are truly inspiring and humbling.

Scottish Rite builds on this firm base and provides a means where the earnest seeker may receive further knowledge and understanding. Membership in a craft lodge is a requirement of joining.

The whole of Canada constitutes a single Scottish Rite jurisdiction, with New Brunswick comprised of three valleys - Valley of Fredericton, Moncton and Saint John

Similar to the Order of the Eastern Star, Scottish Rite provides support to charitable endeavors. The Scottish Rite Charitable Foundation of Canada has been funding medical research in universities and hospitals across Canada into "Puzzles of the Mind" such as Alzheimer's, Parkinson's and other neurodegenerative ailments in the aging population and Dyslexia and Autism in children. In addition, the foundation assists local valleys in opening learning centres for children with Dyslexia which provide free tutoring for them to assist with their learning difficulties. One of the ten learning centres in Canada is located in Moncton. To assure the distribution of funding to all Valleys the foundation approved the availability of an award to each valley with the assistance of the Deputies. These awards are to aid individuals in the process of gaining skills to benefit the training, education or well- being of children institutions or volunteer groups to serve the overall goals of the foundation.

Support provided in 2022 consisted of assistance to 3 students attending university and to the Share Activity Centre, a non profit facility in Saint John promoting self reliance in adults experiencing mental health issues

Before I began this journey, I knew that whatever I chose for my Special Project, it would be something that would involve and benefit children. Brother Darrell and I both believed that we could help make a difference in the lives of young children. We want to thank our membership and many others for their generosity in helping us raise funds towards our causes.

Your generosity enables us to present the New Brunswick Children's Foundation and the Dyslexic Learning Centre with cheques in the amount of \$3859.50 each. I am pleased to have Rev. Jim Postlethwaite here from the New Brunswick Children's Foundation and would ask her/him to come forward to receive our donation. May we hear a few words from you at this time.

NB Children's Foundation

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, M/Worship Grand Master.

Our organization, The New Brunswick Children's Foundation, dates back to the mid 1850's when a number of disasters struck St John. There were problems with the water supply, there were no sewage systems and a growing number of new immigrants were constantly arriving. Added to all of that were both a typhus and a cholera epidemic. As a result, a large number of orphans and destitute mothers were left in the wake of the upheaval. Without much assistance, if any.

A meeting was held attended by 15 Protestant ministers. They issued an appeal for public aid to build an orphanage. By 1854 land was purchased, a building constructed and children were moved in. By the 1970's orphanages were being phased out. The government of Louis Robichaud closed the orphanage in St. John and the New Brunswick Protestant Children's Foundation was formed. All money from the sale of property and donations were given to the new entity. With the mandate to offer financial aid to other charities.

The land formerly belonging to the Foundation is now the site of a New Brunswick Public Housing Project.

The mission of the Foundation is to enhance the lives of children, 18 years and under, who are challenged by health, social and economic issues. We do this by making strategic investments in community driven organizations that are Marking with children and young people.

At present our charity distributes between \$600,00 to \$800,000 a year. It averages out to 200,000 dollars per quarter.

The money that you have donated this evening, like all donations will never be spent. It is invested so that the proceeds can help children as long as the Foundation exists.

We support a large number of community groups without regard to race, creed, or color. That children are being helped is the main priority. I can say that in the year and half or so that I have been a regional director we have gone out of our way to help applicants, to suggest that organizations apply, and help them with paperwork.

The core values in regard to our mission are-always keep the CHILD at the center:

So Caring for the most vulnerable, Healing the hurt the most vulnerable feel, Investing in responsible and productive activity, Leading communities to a better tomorrow and Developing the potential in every child.

There is a very substantial list of recipients that we provide aid to. I wanted to mention a few;

\$40,000 to support to support a hot lunch program at St. Charles School in St. John.

\$18,000 for Fresh Start for Women and Children, St. John to provide support services and prevent homelessness.

\$4300 for the Weekend Backpack program at Townsview school in Woodstock

\$30,000 for the New Brunswick Youth Orchestra in Moncton to buy programs for nine centers for children

\$50,000 for Ronald MacDonald House in Halifax. And the list goes on. Big Brother and Big Sisters in Moncton, Summer camps, day programs, emergency shelters, providing books for children ages 2-5 as part of the Dollywood program. Groups that provide mental health care to young people, sports equipment, building playgrounds, shelters for outdoor activities, riding programs for therapy.

200.00 to supply milk to students at fourteen schools in the Bathurst area. , there is money for agencies that support children and youth with special needs.

We are making funds available to numerous charities all over the province.

The board and regional directors are all volunteers. Our office staff which consists of one overworked lady is phenomenal.

So we work with groups that are providing emotional and therapeutic supports, food, equipment and activities that help children and young people. Their goal is to help them to integrate into wider society in a positive way by offering encouragement, counseling, material supports, and practical help

They are registered charities with operating structures in place and financing to support their work. The Foundation is a partner by offering grants to them. We get regular updates from them to say how their work is progressing.

In closing;

I want to emphasis that your donation this evening will be invested carefully to work pretty much forever, we don't approve all applications but a great many are

So thank for you for your donation this evening, for the opportunity to speak to you and for joining us in our mission. I want to say it was nice to spend an evening amongst the Masonic Family. Thank you.

ANNUAL REPORTS

I would recommend that the incoming Worthy Grand Matron have the Constitution, Laws & Regulations Committee review our Constitution and bring forward any new recommendations at the next session of Grand Chapter. Also, the Grand Officer's Handbook needs review. The Grand Officer's handbook is to be reviewed every 3 years, per a motion in 2004.

I would also recommend that the Elected Grand Officers, which includes the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer, resume meetings with the Finance Committee soon after Grand Chapter. These meetings are very beneficial to everyone to know what expenses, etc. are paid by Grand Chapter.

Article No VI Now Reads

Floral Fund

Sec 1 - The Floral Funds shall consist of contributions collected at the meeting and shall be in the custody of the Treasurer and kept in a Bank Account separate from the General Fund. This fund shall be used a the discretion of the Worthy Matron and the Treasurer shall give an account of the receipts and disbursements for the year in her report at the Annual Meeting.

Article No VI Changed to read:

Floral Fund

Sec 1 — This fund shall consist of funds collected at the meeting and shall be in the custody of the Treasurer with an account being kept of the receipts and disbursements. These funds shall be used at the discretion of the Worthy Matron and the Treasurer shall give a report at the Annual Meeting.

Article No IX - Now reads:

Signings Officers

Sec No 1- The Signing Officers for the Chapter shall be the Worthy Matron, and the Treasurer. In the absence of the Worthy Matron, the Associate Matron shall be the alternate signing Officer.

Article No IX – Changed to read:

Signing Officers

The Signing Officers for the Chapter shall be the Worthy Matron, and the Treasurer. A third member shall be appointed as an alternate and said member must be approved by the Chapter and hold the position until such times she or he is replaced.

Article XI - Now reads:

Committees

Sec 1 – The Finance Committee of the Chapter shall consist of the first four Officers of the Chapter whose duty it shall be to approve all bills submitted to the Chapter for payment.

Sec 2 – The Worthy Matron shall appoint annually a Committee of three whose duty it shall be to visit all members reported sick, and if needing watchers, to see that they are appointed.

Sec 3 – The Worthy Matron shall appoint annual a Committee of three, two Past Matron and one Past Patron, as a Committee of relief whose duty it will be to investigate all applications for relief to the Chapter and make a report to the Chapter at the first meeting following the Application, and make a recommendation to the Chapter as to the amount of relief to be pad. The amount of the relief so paid shall be by a vote of the Chapter.

Article XI - Changed to read:

Committees

Sec 1 – The Finance Committee of the Chapter shall consist of the first four Officers of the Chapter whose duty it shall be to approve all bills submitted to the Chapter for payment.

Sec 2 – REMOVED Sec 3 – REMOVED

Article XX -Addition to the By-Laws

Membership:

Sec 1 - Membership in two subordinate Chapters is permissible under the following conditions:

The By-Laws of any such Chapter must provide for Dual membership before accepting Petitions for such Dual Membership;

No Petition for such dual membership shall be received unless the Chapter in which the Petitioner holds primary membership also permits Dual Membership;

The procedure for receiving and acting on any Petition for Dual Membership shall be the same as any other Petition for Affiliation.

Sec 2 – No person shall be an active member of more than two Chapters.

Sec 3 — Dual members must pay dues in both Chapters, and shall be entitled in all the rights and privileges of membership in both, except Dual Members shall not hold any one of the four principle offices in more than one chapter at the same time. The principal offices being understood to be those of the Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron and Associate Patron. Loss of membership for non-payment of dues in the primary chapter or expulsion in either chapter carries with t the loss of membership in the other. Primary Chapters being defined as the Chapter to which the person has belonged the longest.

Sec 4 – In the instance where a person is elected to one of the top four offices in the 2nd Chapter, the installation of said person in that chapter not be held until the expiration of their office in the first. The top four offices being that of the Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron and Associate Patron

GRANITE CHAPTER #15 - ADDITION EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 10 2021 MEMBERSHIP:

This Chapter will allow for Dual Membership provided the Chapter from which the Petitioner belongs also allows for Dual Membership as long as the provisions of Constitution Laws and Regulations of the GrandChapter are met.

ZETLAND CHAPTER #26 – ADDITION EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 16, 2021: MEMBERSHIP ARTICLE 4:

This Chapter, as long as the provisions of the Constitution and Regulations are met, will allows for Dual Membership provided the Chapter from which the Petitioner belongs also allows for Dual Membership.

<u>DEVON CHAPTER #37 – ADDITION EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 11, 2021:</u> MEMBERSHIP ARTICLE XIII, SECTION 9:

Members of this Chapter can hold Dual Membership in other Chapters as long as all provisions of the Constitution Laws and Regulations of the Grand Chapter and the By-Laws of the other Chapter are met.

2022 Report on Grand Officers Handbook Lynn Hutchin, Past Grand Matron

It is the responsibility of the Associate Grand Matron to prepare Handbooks for her Officers after her Installation as Worthy Grand Matron. Brother Doug Swan, PGP, Grand Secretary, has been doing this since he helped Sis Lynda Swan with it in 2015. We thank him for taking care of this for the last seven years, but it is time for the Associate Grand Matron to resume this duty.

Suggestions / Changes:

The handbook should include a cover letter for the soon to Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron which would include information on Grand Family Visits and what to wear.

The names, addresses, phone #s, email address, spouse, birthday, anniversary. Dates of Official Visits, Grand Officer School of Instruction, Chapter Schools of Instruction, Grand Family Exchanges.

There are multiple issues of the Red Book being used so we suggest page numbers not be used, instead use the Index titles.

Under Quorum: Include - The Offices needed to be filled and required for the transaction of business are Worthy Matron, Associate Matron, Secretary, Conductress, Chaplain, Warder and Sentinel. Any sister or brother may fill be called upon to fill vacancies.

Examination of a Visitor – Instructions are in the Red Book and Ritual has the test oath. We suggest that it be deleted from the grand officer handbook. It is in the Worthy Matrons handbook and in the 2018-2021 Deputy Handbook of General Grand Chapter.

Carried Ballot – Change to the instructions found in the 2018-2021 Deputy Handbook of General Grand Chapter. The order of voting has changed.

Introductions – The order of Introductions has changed by Sis Glenda Winchester in her Notes of Interest 2021-2024. Grand Representatives will now be introduced before Deputies, Ambassadors, Special Appointments if not Past Grands.

Notes from past Grand Officer Schools of Instruction should be incorporated into the body of the handbook.

Additional Responsibilities for the Associate Grand Conductress and the Grand Conductress (July 2013) need to be added to the Responsibilities Section of the Handbook.

The Duties of Convenors (July 2013) need to be added to the Responsibility Section of the Handbook.

Recommendation – to be included in Handbook in the Introduction Section. Members introduced should <u>not</u> say 'Thank You' after Grand Honours or a Hearty Welcome. For the sake of continuity, they should acknowledge with a slight head nod. Saying 'Thank You' has just started in the last few years.

Recommendation – because the Worthy Matrons Handbook is usually included in the Grand Officer Handbook and they both have to be reviewed every three years, we recommend that they be reviewed by the same committee to assure consistency.

For the environmentally conscious – this handbook could be saved to a flash drive and given to the Grand Officers. They could then be downloaded it to their computer or print off what they want to save as a hard copy.
