Sixteen years ago, we almost closed the Eastern Star Magazine which has been published regularly four times a year since 1949. There were good reasons given - the magazine was too costly to print and to mail, subscription money was almost gone, subscriptions price was \$10 per year, and it was felt that no one would pay more than that for a fraternal publication.

Sister Donna Allen was asked to see what we can do to keep it alive. She contacted me and several others and a new committee was formed. We had a few challenges right away. With money short and only a month to design and fill our next issue, we decided that we needed to format and publish the magazine ourselves. This would save \$700.00 per issue or \$2800 a year.

Somehow, we did it! The first magazine was a little rough around the edges, but it worked. We revived the advertising, made Christmas Greetings desirable and received support from the Chapters. Everyone pitched in after a few months we were actually moving into the black, growing more financially secure and increasing our subscriptions with each issue.

Five of us stuck with it since 2007, Donna and Colin Allen, Dorothy Allan, myself and Lynda Williams. Where did the time go! Sixteen years have gone by and it is time for change and <u>new</u> ideas.

She became a Charter Member of Philip A. Jerguson Chapter #18, in 1945. She served as Worthy Matron for the two Chapters and has had several offices in both Chapters. Sister Pauline served as a Grand Representative of Pennsylvania, in New Brunswick. In 1981 she was elected Worthy Grand Matron of New Brunswick and in 1982, along with her Worthy Grand Patron, Douglas Hannah held their "Precious Jewels" Grand Chapter Session.

Pauline's early exposure to the wider Eastern Star world occurred in 1946 in Tampa Florida where she attended the installation of our New Brunswick Brother R. Donald Stewart as MWGP. Since then, she has attended several Triennial Assemblies of General Grand Chapter.

She was honoured by an appointment as Worthy Grand Warder from 1982 – 1985. As an officer of the General Grand Chapter, Pauline attended the Grand Sessions of most jurisdictions throughout the United States and
