I have been given the privilege to pay tribute to the flags, which have just been presented - each representing a significant part of our beloved Order.

THE FLAG OF NEW BRUNSWICK - The Provincial Flag of this Grand Jurisdiction was adopted by proclamation on February 24th, 1965. The symbols depicted on the flag are taken from the Coat-of-Arms

assigned in 1868. They are a gold lion on a red field across the top and an ancient galley across the base. The province takes its name from the Dutchy of Brunswick in Germany, which in 1784, the year the Province was established, was in the possession of King George III of England.

The arms of Brunswick consist of two gold lions on a red field and the arms of the King contained the three gold lions of England. The gold lion in the flag, therefore, reflects New Brunswick's relationship both to the Dutchy of Brunswick and to England.

The galley is the conventional heraldic representation of a ship and reflects the two principal economic activities - shipping and ship building- carried on in this province when the Coat of Arms was assigned.

May we ever be reminded of our heritage and the sacrifices of those who have gone before us.

THE CHRISTIAN FLAG - The white, blue and red Christian Flag is an emblem of love and a reminder of our dependence upon our Heavenly Father and His Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

The white on the flag represents purity and peace. The blue stands for faithfulness, truth and sincerity. Red, of course, is the color of sacrifice, in this case calling to mind the blood shed by Christ on Calvary, represented by the cross.

May we always be prepared to follow the Christian Flag.

THE EASTERN STAR FLAG - The Eastern Star Flag symbolizes the teaching of our beautiful Order, reminding us of the principles of Fidelity, Constancy, Loyalty, Faith and Love. It represents the global scope of our fraternal bonds and reminds us that we are all Sisters and Brothers wherever we may be.

May we always remember our obligations and live by the principles of our Order.

THE TEXAS STATE FLAG - Six flags have flown over Texas since Spanish explorers introduced the first one in the early sixteenth century. The present "Lone Star Flag" was adopted on January 24th 1839 as the national flag of the Republic of Texas. It was later adopted as the State Flag when Texas became the 28th state in 1845. Today it flies over an area of more than 268,000 square miles of diverse landscape and in excess of 25 million diverse residents.

Texas has evolved from its earliest stage when the legendary "Texas Cowboy" was the mainstay. By the 20th century oil became an important element of the economy and, with the advent of oil came technology.

The State of Texas today ranks second, both in area and population, among the states of the United States.

The State Flag is one of three colors - blue, white and red to embrace the National colors - adorned with a single Star. The blue stands for loyalty, the white represents purity and the red is for bravery.

We honour this flag tonight as the representative of the home state of our Most Worthy Grand Matron.

THE NOVA SCOTIA FLAG - Created in 1858, the Flag of Nova Scotia is a blue saltire on a white field and bears the Royal Arms of Scotland to acknowledge the heritage of its founding fathers and is the only flag of the Canadian Provinces, which pre-dates Confederation.

This flag flies over the 2nd smallest of our Canadian provinces which has an area of 21,000 square miles and a population of 1 million people of various ethnic ancestry.

The economy of Nova Scotia has, over the years, been resource based - fishing, farming and mining. The advance of technology has added manufacturing, communications and tourism.

We honour this flag as the representative of the home province of our Most Worthy Grand Patron.

THE FLAG OF THE PROVINCE OF PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND -

The flag of the Province of Prince Edward Island features the English heraldic lion which appears on the coat of arms of Prince Edward, Duke of Kent, for whom the province is named, and on that of King Edward VII. Also featured is an island on which appears three small oak saplings - representing the three counties of this island province - under the protection of a great oak tree representing Great Britain.

Noted for the hospitality of its people, the economy is driven by farming, fishing and a thriving tourism industry.

We honour the Flag of Prince Edward Island as together with that of Nova Scotia they represent the Grand Jurisdiction of our Most Worthy Grand Patron.

The following new business was conducted:

Notice of Motion: Sister Shirley MacDonald, PGM - Chairman

On behalf of the Finance Committee as per the Notice of Motion sent to all the Chapters, I am prepared to move that the registration fee for attendance at Grand Chapter Sessions be increased to \$15.00 per member beginning in July 2011. Seconded by Brother Graham Vincent.

Debates

I will make a recommendation (WGM interrupted and asked that the recommendation if needed, be after the vote on the motion on the floor)

Sister Donna Allen, GGCCM, Fort Moncton #11. I agree with Brother Clinton – when I read the Notice of Motion, I could not see the connection with the money - I thought there was lots so of money in Grand Chapter and if there was a problem with the money, I think it has nothing to do with raising the registration fee – I think we have lots of money and I don't think that should be the reason for raising it to \$15.00.

Motion was defeated.

The Notice of Motion that was sent to the Chapters is as follows: The following is being proposed by the Finance Committee at Grand Chapter in July:

Whereas the Grand Treasurer of this Grand Chapter found it necessary to collapse an Investment to meet existing expenses thereby experiencing financial difficulties and whereas the financial objective of our Organization is to provide for benevolent projects, we, the Finance Committee, will move or cause to be moved the following at the next Grand Chapter Session, to be held in July of 2010:

“The registration Fee for attendance at Grand Chapter Sessions be increased to \$15.00 per member beginning in July of 2011.”

Moved by Brother Clinton Shaffer, PGP, and seconded by Sister Mildred Homer, Grand Conductress, that the Investment Council, at their discretion, be given the authority by this Grand Chapter to release money to the Finance Committee as needed from Certificate No. 5080-8065148-13, maturity date September 22, 2010. Motion carried.

Recommended by the Web Master, Brother Bill Boone, that we allow specific Google Ads on our site - Pay Per Click - as a means to generate payment and to become self-sufficient. No Motion was forthcoming - there will be no further action at this time.

Moved by Sister Lynne Hatt, PGM and seconded by Sister Mildred Homer, Grand Conductress, that we add a Directory to our Web Page, containing addresses and times of Chapter meetings, and a Contact Person, and make it available to the General Public. Motion carried.
